FTE-3 classroom

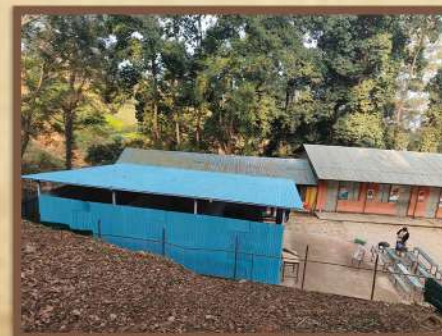
When disaster strikes, the strength of community is what pulls us through. On September 27-28, 2024, heavy rains caused massive flooding and landslides throughout the Kathmandu Valley, and one of the worst-hit areas was Godavari municipality, where Shree Adharbhat Madhyamik Vidhyalaya stands. A landslide destroyed a concrete road above the school, sending debris crashing onto the building and completely destroying four classrooms.

Though it was a Saturday, and no students were on site at the time, the damage left the school in a tough spot. Without classrooms, the school could not reopen, and many students could be left without a place to learn. The principal contacted Round Table members, asking for help to build temporary classrooms. The situation was urgent, and while government funding could take years, the school needed a solution immediately.

Round Table members, led by Hitesh Agrawal, responded without hesitation. Even though they didn't have enough funds for the project, they made a bold decision to raise the necessary money among themselves and complete the construction in just 15 days. Hitesh, who handles hardware for such projects, quickly organized the materials and secured a contractor. By the end of October, the temporary structure was complete—three new classrooms ready for students to return. A formal handover ceremony was held on November 9, 2024, with the presence of the RTN President, members of the board, table members, students, parents, and local officials. It was a proud moment for all of us, knowing that we had played a part in getting these students back to their studies.

This project is a powerful reminder of the importance of education and the difference we can make when we come together. It's not just about rebuilding classrooms; it's about rebuilding the future for these children. Education opens doors, and no matter the challenge, we must always work to ensure that every child has access to it.

As we look back on this achievement, we're reminded of the words that guide us: the power of education can change lives, and the commitment to service can rebuild them.

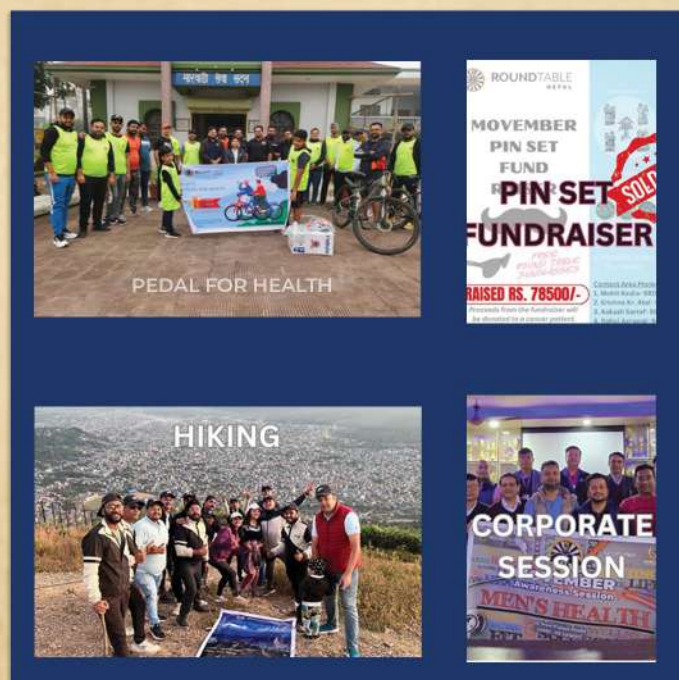




This November, as part of its nationwide efforts, Round Table Nepal organized several awareness programs aimed towards raising awareness for men's health, as part of the global Movember campaign.

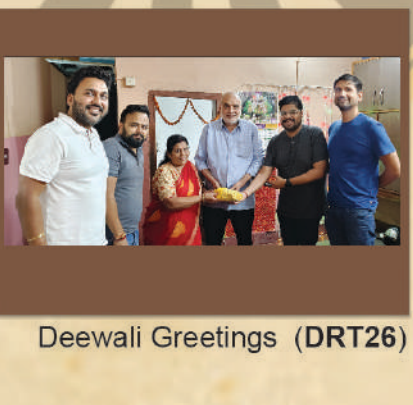

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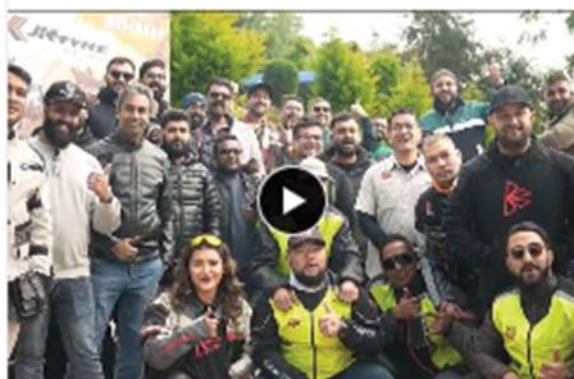
